MANAGEMENT REPORT: ATTENTION VETERINARY FOUNDATION WE SPEAK FOR THEM

During the month of March, all of the patients that were given medical treatment in February were followed up with. The canine patients in the corral and the feline patients were visually evaluated for changes in their respective areas of treatment during each visit.

CANINES

During the daily checks on the canine patients, four cases of dermatitis were found. They were treated with the pertinent treatment. Four other patients in the corral with gastroenteric issues were treated with oral treatments. Additionally, checks on every patient's vaccine and deparasitation cards were done in order to distribute the annual vaccinations for 38 of the patients and deparasitation for 60 of the patients. 13 sterilizations in female canines, 8 castrations in male canines, and the extraction of a skin tumor were all done in March as well.

FELINES

In the area for feline patients, there was an outbreak of a feline respiratory complex. The patients with the most severe respiratory symptoms were identified and four felines were isolated in the hospitalization area. The pertinent treatments were applied and the HEEL PROTOCOL FOR RESPIRATORY ILLNESSES were followed preventively for the 40 felines in total. The enucleation of a feline patient who was rescued was also achieved. A total of 11 sterilizations were done to female felines.

RABBITS

The rabbits with previous bite wounds from the previous month have shown a total recovery of their wounds. One patient was found with new bite wounds and they were treated and isolated from the rest of the patients in order to check on them.

DUBRASKA

Dubraska is an equine patient with bilateral ocular hypoplasia condition. Dubraska was treated with an enucleation. The patient is being checked on for their recovery from their wounds, which are healing as part of the proper healing process. Nevertheless, in the right ocular cavity there is a moderate serous secretion. The area was cleaned and a dose of antibiotics was given. The patient is being maintained in observation in order to evaluate the evolution of the secretion.
